The WOW Project is a careers education programme designed to inspire, motivate and equip all children and young people for the World of Work. The project spans every stage of the learning journey, from Early Years Foundation Stage to Post 16, and activities are carefully designed in partnership with teachers and business professionals. Pupils gradually build on skills and knowledge gained each year, meaning that they leave school 'work ready', able to make informed decisions about their next destinations, and can flourish when they get there.

This year we are very grateful that Angie has had more input than ever before into our strategic planning and provision of careers from Year 7 – Year 13. Some of the events that she has assisted us in providing are listed in the events section on page 2.

Adapting our Curriculum

The Future Skills Questionnaire (FSQ) leading to improvements in our delivery

The Future Skills Questionnaire is a resource from the Careers and Enterprise Company (CEC) which supports Careers Leaders in schools nationally to evaluate their careers programme by gathering data on learners' careers knowledge and skills. This is the second year that the majority of our students have completed the FSQ.

Last year, results indicated that students felt happy with the careers provision that they received and clearly benefitted from their dedicated careers lessons. Importantly, it also showed us that students wanted more specific information on the different types of vocational routes including BTECs/Apprenticeships/T Levels and Traineeships. We therefore embedded a suite of lessons into our curriculum from Y7-11 to ensure that students had more opportunities to find out about, and discuss, these routes into work.

This year, early results show that this intervention is starting to pay off, student confidence is clearly increasing in these areas, but we are still focussed on making further improvements, based on this year's findings.


