

What Impact Does Attendance Have?

We are delighted that our GCSE results in 2023 were again well above local and regional averages but we want all our students to experience this success. Attendance has a massive impact on exam outcomes!

Attendance	Average GCSE Grade	Average Progress 8
Above 98 %	5.7	+0.47
95% to 98%	5.4	+0.25
92% to 95%	5.3	+0.14
Below 92%	3.8	-0.65

This table shows the average GCSE grade achieved by GSHS students and average attendance.

An attendance figure of 95% over the year means that students have lost 2 weeks of learning......

Restorative questions


What happened last lesson?

After School Detentions


- On the rare occasion that a student is removed from a lesson they will need to complete an after-school detention on the same day.
- Duty Support (taken away from a lesson) 30 minutes.
- Relocation (being sent to another teacher to work) 20 minutes.
- At the end of the day, the teacher will come to speak to the student in detention to explain what is required for them to avoid being removed in future.

Mobile Phones

 The use of mobile phones is not permitted in school. If a student uses their phone in school it will be confiscated and they can collect it at the end of the day in the first instance. After that, parents will need to collect it for them.

Class Charts

Class Charts is an online system which teachers use to track achievement and behaviour throughout the school day. We believe in working closely with parents and carers.

One of the key benefits of using Class Charts is that we are able to securely share your child(s) achievements with you and to keep you up to date in real-time.


Class Charts is also be used to communicate homework.



Celebrating Success

- Success Builder points collect as many as you can, these replace LORIC points.
- SPORTS cards will be allocated in PE and are also worth 10 points.
- **Points totals** will be used to nominate students for gifts/prizes/awards every term in rewards assemblies.
- Points totals will also be used to select students for prizes at the end of the year
- There will be a **Golden Ticket** draw (£50 prize) once a term.
- Each week we have 'Hot Choc Friday', with teachers nominating students who have done well during that week
- There will also be termly rewards activities for students who have excelled in that term.



Year 7 Mathematics

What they will learn

In Year 7, students continue to review and extend the number, shape and data topics covered in primary school.

We also introduce new (or almost new) topics such as algebra and probability.

Students are encouraged to apply mathematical skills to more extended problems and focus on explaining their reasoning.

How you can support them

Ensuring your child knows their times tables and helping them to practice if not. Fluency with times tables will make most areas of Maths more accessible.

Encourage students to complete their Sparx Maths HL every week and praise them when they do.

Present a positive, 'can do' attitude to Maths.



Year 7 English

What they will study

- An introduction to poetry
- 'Oliver Twist'
- 'I am Malala'
- 'The Tempest'
- All underpinned by the What, How, Why approach to reading and analysing texts
- Big Write on a Friday
- Accelerated Reader lesson once a fortnight
- Students must read for 35 minutes each day


How you can support them

- Encourage reading of all kinds
- Ensure reading record is kept up to date for AR lessons
- Encourage the completion of English Home Learning – these are connected to Tier 2 vocabulary and developing an understanding of different text types.
- Stress the importance of English for future life choices/careers.


